Hope is an anchor and helmet. Paul tells us to put on the breastplate of faith "and for a helmet the hope of salvation" (1 The. 5:8). Hope is the anchor of the soul. Many are now driven by the wild winds of the angry sea and will soon be wrecked on the rocks of the distant shore. Only a good anchor can keep them from certain death. Paul says, "we have a strong consolation (encouragement) who fled for our refuge to lay hold upon the hope set before us: which is the anchor of the soul" (Heb. 6:18-19). Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: (Mat. 5:11-12).

Let us "rejoice in hope" and be "patient in tribulation" and "continue instant (steadfastly) in prayer" (Rom. 12:12).
